1. Welcome & Introductions

Meeting began with welcome greeting. Members gave brief introductions of themselves and their agency/organization.

2. Discuss Website

SNECAC members were asked if they had any changes/updates to report based on what is on the website. No changes/updates were reported.

Members were asked to please report changes/updates to be able to keep website and roll current.

3. Mini Case Study Review

Due to the lack of time, the review of the 3rd case study has been post pone until the next SNECAC meeting in October. As a reminder, the 3rd case study provided by Mirzah Trejo from the Nevada Institute for Children's Research and Policy is provided below and attached.

With the object being to discover possible resources available through SNECAC members here's a collective impact mock scenario for members to consider:

Mom calls in very concern to ask for assistance. She is afraid of ending up with legal issues concerning her 5 year old son. The boy has just started Kinder and has already been suspended multiple times. The last suspension was due to him maliciously punching the pregnant belly of his teacher. The mom states that he has also tried hurting her in the past and has threatened to kill her and his step sister. She states the boy tells her that the voices in his head tell him he needs to kill them. Her son has been in counseling for 4 years, but she has not seen any improvement in his conduct or behavior. The boy's counselor has advised the mom to seek psychological treatment and a possible medication regiment to control his behavior.

The mom never married the boy's father and they are no longer together. Mom was told that in order to seek psychological or medical treatment the father has to sign consent, but he refuses to do so. The mother states that the father thinks she is exaggerating and has told her that punching and kicking is "what boys do." The mom started to cry because she does not know what else to do. She mentioned that she feels like she is a bad mother for being afraid of being alone with her little boy. The boy's counselor has told her that if she does not seek help as soon as possible, her son will end up in juvenile detention at some point and she

may encounter charges of her own. She wants to know if there is a way that she can get her son treatment without the father's consent or if his consent can be overridden due to the seriousness of the case.

How can your organization/agency help?

4. SNECAC Initiative: Learning Party

Due to the council's positive feedback in the last meeting regarding the content of the learning party, the subcommittee moved forward with the development of a script and additional handouts for the Learning Party.

During the meeting, the subcommittee reviewed the purpose and outline of the Party and divided the council into 2 groups. Each group was asked to read through the script, discuss the content, highlighting pros and cons, and share their thoughts.

Due to the council's engagement, the review and discussion of the Learning Party took the whole meeting. Members were asked to hand in any notes/comments they had and/or to email them to Mirzah (mirzah.trejo@unlv.edu) to be able to use the feedback to finalize the content.

The subcommittee will use the feedback received to make edits to the content and have everything ready by the next SNECAC meeting in October to review one last time with the council and be able to move forward with scheduling.

AS A REMINDER: What is a Learning Party?

Purpose:

• The idea of our learning party is to get principals, directors, and admins to understand the true importance and impact early childhood education has on the development of a child. This may seem like common knowledge, but there is still a disconnect, even within the educational system.

Learning Party Outline:

- Audience: K-12 principals, directors, and admins, however, anyone at the school is welcome to attend
- Length: 30 minutes to 60 minutes
 - 1. Intro Strong Start Overview, including ECE benefits and access in Nevada
 - 2. How Standards Connect Linking Early Learning Standards
 - 3. Demonstrations/Activities providing hands on aspect to those in attendance of what and how children learn and develop
 - 4. Closing Asks of the Audience

Objective:

• With these Learning Parties the council is hoping to be able to narrow the gap between the Pre-K-2 and K-8 licensure, highlighting the level of importance or lack of preparation there is in Pre-K classrooms, teachers, and settings.

Who will present the Learning Parties?
